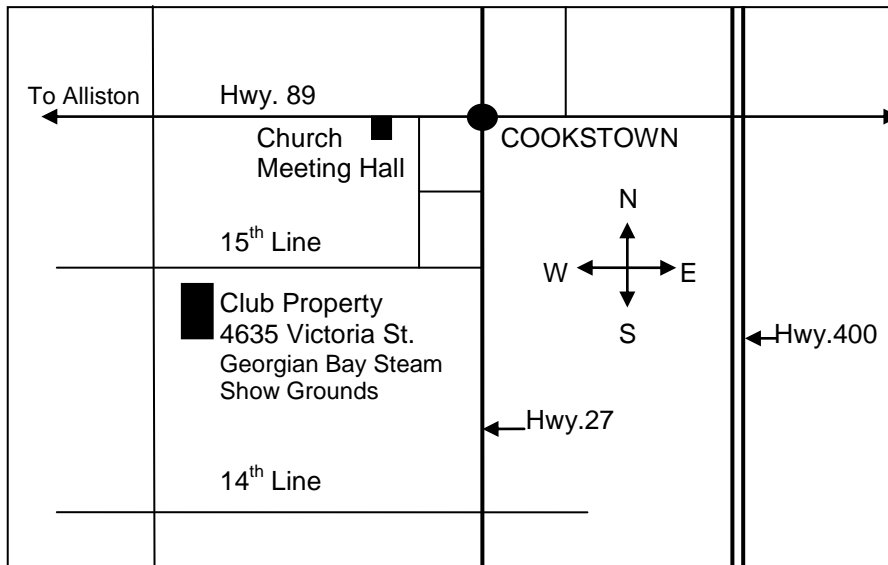


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Due to limited space for this year’s fair, please note a few changes:

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership application forms and information are available from the office. Applications for membership are available January 1st to December 31st of each year.

EXHIBITORS/ENTRY FEES

2. Each participant must pay a \$5.00 Exhibitors Fee except for those entering in the 4H Livestock and Junior Fair Departments. The Exhibitors Fee permits the participant to exhibit in as many classes as he/she wishes, subject to an entry fee where required, or where entries are limited for the class.
3. Exhibitor Fees and Entry Fees must be submitted with signed entry forms. Faxed/E-mailed entries must include VISA INFORMATION (Cardholders name, card number and expiry date)

LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION

4. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits that may cause injury or damage to persons coming in contact with them shall take all precautions to safeguard the public, including but not limited to, guarding their exhibits, providing barriers to protect the public, providing restraints as required, etc.. The exhibitor agrees to indemnify and save harmless, The Barrie Agricultural Society and its directors and staff from and against all claims, demands, costs, penalties, fines, charges and expenses whatsoever resulting from damage caused by the exhibitor and/or his/her exhibit to any person or persons, animal or property.
5. The Barrie Agricultural Society will take reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of the exhibits sent to the exhibition, but the owners themselves must take risks of exhibiting them and should any exhibit or portion thereof be injured, damaged, lost or stolen, the Barrie Agricultural Society will give assistance towards the recovery of same, but will not be liable or make any payment for the value thereof.
6. The Barrie Agricultural Society shall not be liable for any loss to an exhibitor occasioned by fire, accident, condition of structure or the negligence of other exhibitors, of officials, or otherwise howsoever.
7. Every animal or exhibitor at any show of this Society must be the actual BONA FIDE property of the exhibitor at the time the entry is made of such animal (except where specifically mentioned in the prize list), save and except implements, manufactured articles and musical instruments which may be exhibited by agent of the manufacturers and all grain, roots, flowers and garden vegetables. MUST HAVE BEEN GROWN BY THE EXHIBITOR IN THE CURRENT YEAR.
8. No animal or article is to be exhibited in more than one class or section except where specifically mentioned in the prize list.
9. No person shall be allowed to enter more than one specimen in any class. This rule is NOT to apply to livestock, but to all kinds of grain, seeds, roots, flowers, manufactured articles, etc., in which case the additional specimens would necessarily be precisely similar to the first.

WORTHY EXHIBITS

10. No animal or articles entered for competition shall necessarily entitle the winner to a premium, unless deemed worthy for a prize by the judges.

DECISION OF JUDGES

11. Any person who shall attempt to interfere with the judges or exhibition officials while in the discharge of their duties, or who shall afterwards on the premises of the Association use any contemptuous or abusive language to any judge in consequence of any award made by him, shall forfeit his right to any premiums to which he might otherwise be entitled and shall be excluded from membership in the Society for one year thereafter. Judges are particularly requested to immediately report any breach of this rule to the President or General Manager of the Barrie Agricultural Society.
12. Judges Decision is final.

ENTRIES

13. Completing the entry form correctly is the responsibility of the agent/exhibitor, which includes entering exhibits in the correct class. Exhibits permitted to show that are entered in the incorrect class will not receive prize money for that class.
14. The President, Vice-President and General Manager have been duly authorized to enforce Sec. 32, Sub-Sec. 1 of the Agricultural and Arts Act. The officers of such society or association may by the rules and regulations prohibit and prevent all kinds of gambling

theatrical, circus or mountebank performances, attendant or other persons in charge of said exhibits or shows, and also regulate the huckstering or trafficking in fruits, goods, wares or merchandise on the Exhibition grounds, or within 300 yards thereof, and any person who after due notice of such rules and regulations, violates the same, shall be liable to be removed by the officers, policemen or constables of the said association or society and be subject to the penalty described by the next preceding section of the Act.

15. It is understood that the exhibitors shall release the Barrie Agricultural Society, its officers and directors from all claims for damages arising from loss or destruction of, or injury to any property such, whether occasioned by negligence or otherwise, and the exhibitors agree to indemnify the Barrie Agricultural Society against all claims or demands of any kind or nature by reason of any loss, injury or damage occasioned by any animal or other exhibit, arising from the negligence of injury or damage to any such attendant or person in charge, or the property of such.

LIVESTOCK

16. Livestock must arrive at the specified time as stated in prize book.
17. Exhibitors when entering the grounds must apply to the Livestock Superintendent whose duty it is to direct them to where their exhibits are to be placed and read all papers.

BEDDING

18. Bedding is the responsibility of the exhibitor

LIVESTOCK AND HORSES – ADMISSION POLICY

19. (1) Livestock vehicle and driver – Free
(2) One to three animals – One person Free
(3) Four to six animals – Two persons Free
(4) Over six animals – three persons Free
ALL EXHIBITORS MUST ACCOMPANY HORSES OR LIVESTOCK OR PAY ADMISSION AND PARKING.
20. Special rules pertaining to each particular class will be printed at the top of the page or preceding each class, and exhibitors are asked to pay strict attention to these rules, as they will be enforced.
21. ALL correspondence, requests for information, entries, etc., must be forwarded to the BARRIE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY, Box 217, Barrie, Ontario L4M 4T2 Tel: (705) 737-3670 Fax: (705) 737-2581
22. The Secretary-Treasurer will issue cheques in payment of prizes or premiums by mail. All prize money cheques must be presented for payment on or before November 1st otherwise same will become the property of the Society. Any errors or mistakes must be reported in writing with itemized statement of prizes claimed before September 30, 2010 or they will not be considered.

WEATHER

23. In the event of bad weather, with a consequent loss in gate receipts, the Society reserves the right to pay a percentage of the prize money.

ERRORS

24. The society will not be held responsible for any errors, printing or otherwise, in this Prize List Book.
25. The Society has the right to expel any animal from the grounds provided it is suffering from communicable disease.
26. The Barrie Agricultural Society reserves all rights to its grounds and may restrict or prohibit admittance to the grounds to any person or group of persons without giving reason of such action and, the society may refuse the privilege of exhibiting to any individual without disclosing the reasons for such refusal and, all members, exhibitors and others must place animals, cars, trucks and exhibits as instructed by the officials or remove same from the grounds.
27. In order to conform with the Township of Innisfil's Bylaws and the Liquor Control Board of Ontario, there will be **NO SMOKING and NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES** permitted in any of the barns, tents, buildings or on the Fair grounds. Exhibitors/anyone who does not follow this policy will not be permitted to exhibit; prize money will be withheld and there will be NO REFUNDS of Entry/Exhibitor's fees. You will also be asked to leave the grounds.
28. **LIABILITY INSURANCE - It is the responsibility of each horse & livestock exhibitor to carry at least 1 million dollars liability insurance, certificates to be submitted with entry forms.**
29. Livestock exhibitors are responsible to maintain the barn/s and walkways in a clean and tidy fashion. All garbage is to be placed in garbage containers – straw only in manure pit. If barn is not left in a clean and tidy condition, each exhibitor will be deducted \$25.00 from prize winnings.
30. **ALL Faxed/On-Line Entry forms must be accompanied with a VISA CARD Number, Cardholders Name, and Expiry date to be processed. Entry forms will not be processed without payment in full.**

RULES & REGULATIONS

General Rules & Regulations of the Barrie Agricultural Society shall apply to The Barrie Junior Fair, except as otherwise stated herein.

1. **ELIGIBILITY TO EXHIBIT**

- a) Those eligible to exhibit in the Barrie Junior Fair are all those persons, of Simcoe and any other County up to 21 years of age as of Jan. 01, 2010.
- b) Livestock show open to 4-H Members and NON 4-H Members
- c) There is NO Junior Exhibitor Fee in the Livestock Junior Fair when submitting entry form.
- d) Entries must be submitted on the enclosed entry form no later than August 6, 2010. NO LATE ENTRIES will be accepted
- e) Livestock must be washed, fitted, clipped & groomed by the exhibitor only on the day of show. Exhibitors not complying will be excused from the showing.

2. **HEALTH REGULATIONS**

If any animal is deemed unworthy, exhibitor must remove animal at Livestock Superintendent's discretion.

3. **ENTRIES**

Completing the entry form correctly is the responsibility of the agent/exhibitor, which includes entering animal exhibits in the correct class. Exhibits permitted to show that are entered in the incorrect class will not receive prize money for that class.

4. **EXHIBITS**

- a) No animal or article is to be accepted in more than one class or section except where specifically mentioned in the prize list. Exhibits shown previously at our Junior Fair are not eligible.
- b) All exhibits are to be selected or prepared and placed by the exhibitor except in the case of Club exhibits, where the Club leader may assist in supervising and placing the exhibit. Exhibits not placed by the exhibitor are subject to disqualification at the discretion of the Committee-in-Charge.
- c) **Eligibility**
 - i) Livestock entered in the Conformation, Showmanship and Group of 3 sections must be eligible for an individual 4-H project competition.
 - ii) Exhibitors are restricted to one entry in the Conformation, Showmanship and Group of 3 Section.

5. **PLACING EXHIBITS**

- a) Livestock to be on grounds on the day of the show by 8:00am for Dairy and Sheep, 10:00am for Beef and released at 4:00pm.
- b) Hall exhibits to be placed on Thurs Aug 26 between the hours of 3pm-9pm.
- c) There will be NO EARLY RELEASES. Any livestock or exhibits removed prior to 4:00pm will forfeit prize money.

6. **BEDDING**

Is the responsibility of the exhibitor. No shavings or large bales please.

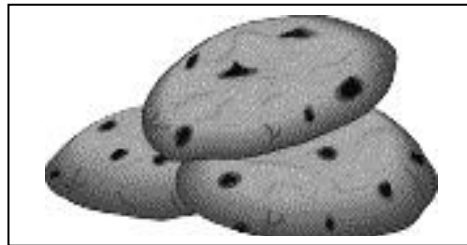

- 2 eggs
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips



Preheat oven to 300 degrees

In a mixing bowl combine flour, soda and salt, mix well with whisk and set aside

In a large bowl with electric mixer, blend both sugars at medium speed.

Add butter and continue to mix until it forms a grainy, paste, scraping down the sides of the bowl as you mix

Add the eggs and vanilla extract and mix at medium speed until mixture is light and fluffy

Add flour mixture and chocolate chips, blend at low speed until just mixed. Do not over mix.

Drop dough by rounded teaspoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets, about 2 inches apart.

Bake 21 to 24 minutes or until golden brown

Transfer cookies immediately to a cool surface with spatula

Makes approximately 3-1/2 dozen

General Conditions

- A. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor, exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agriculture Societies (OAAS) to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Entry quilts must be a minimum of 72" x 90" (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next levels of competition)
- C. The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by OAAS.
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the OAAS Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning OAAS Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competition.

Local Fair Competition

1. Each local fair is entitled to send only the GRAND CHAMPION QUILT (min. 72" x 90") judged the best show of all eligible hand quilted quilts to the District Competition **OR** If any entry wins GRAND CHAMPION or BEST OF ALL ELIGIBLE QUILTS at more than one Fair, the other Fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, should enter their RESERVE CHAMPION or SECOND BEST OF SHOW OF ALL CLASSES quilt in the District Competition.
NOTE: If an Exhibitor wins GRAND CHAMPION or BEST OF SHOW OF ALL ELIGIBLE quilts at other than his/her own fair, or at more than one Fair, the Exhibitors must consider the Agricultural Society nearest his/her home address as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the District meeting.
2. An Exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different quilt as different Fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning quilt to compete at the District Competition.
3. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a GRAND CHAMPION or BEST OF SHOW of all ELIGIBLE quilts. As well as RESERVE Grand Champion or SECOND Best of Show of all ELIGIBLE quilts.

The GRAND CHAMPION and the RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION are judged from all first and second prize ELIGIBLE quilts.

District Competitions

1. Judging quilts at the District Competitions will be the responsibility of each OAAS District.
2. The first place winning hand quilted quilt from the District Competition is eligible to enter the OAAS Championship Quilt Competition at their Annual Convention.

In cases where the winner of the District First Prize Quilt decides not to enter the Final Championship Competition, the Second Prize quilt winner at the District Competition will be eligible.

3. The OAAS will award a ribbon and prize money of \$25.00 for First Place, \$15.00 for Second Place and \$10.00 for Third to Exhibitors of winning hand quilted quilts at each District Competition.
4. All District entries must be registered on the OAAS Championship Quilt entry Form, returned to the OAAS c/o Kathryn Lambert, by December 1st for payment of prize money. (Note: Late entry forms may disqualify the District Quilt entry from the competition)

OAAS ANNUAL MACHINE-QUILTED QUILT/WALL HANGING COMPETITION

Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies - *Eligibility, Rules & Regulations*

General Conditions

- A. Quilt/Wall Hanging must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor, exhibited and judged at a local OAAS Fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt/Wall Hanging to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 192 inches or 480 cm. Note the article can be square, rectangular, etc.
- C. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging will be selected at the annual OAAS Convention.
- D. Upon making an entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- E. The winning OAAS Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- F. The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on a sign provided by the OAAS.
- G. The Quilt/Wall Hanging **must not** be quilted using a long arm machine and must be machine quilted by the exhibitor.
- H. Quilt/Wall Hanging must have visible machine quilting.

Local Fair Competitions

1. Each local fair is entitled to send only one Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging, judged best of show of all eligible machine quilted Quilt/Wall Hangings to the District **OR** If any entry wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Machine Quilted Quilts/Wall Hanging at more than one Fair, the other Fairs at which this item was entered and won, should enter their Reserve Champion or Second Best of Show of eligible Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hangings in the District Competition.
NOTE: If an exhibitor wins Grand Champion or Best of Show of all eligible Machine Quilted classes at other than his/her own fair, or at more than one Fair, the Exhibitor must consider the Agricultural Society nearest his/her home address as the one from which the Quilt/Wall Hanging will be sent to the District Competition.
2. An Exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different machine quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging at different Fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning Quilt/Wall Hanging to compete at the District Competition.
3. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a *Grand Champion* or *Best of Show* of all eligible *Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging* as well as a *Reserve Champion* or *Second Best of Show* of eligible Machine Quilted Quilt/Wall Hanging.

The GRAND CHAMPION and the RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION are judged from all first and second prize ELIGIBLE machine quilted Quilts/Wall Hangings.
